

Free Medicare Counseling with HICAP

Preventive services through Medicare are a great way to stay healthy and catch potential issues early. Medicare also includes two important visits: the *Welcome to Medicare* and the *Yearly Wellness Visit*.

The Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program (HICAP) offers free, confidential counseling and education about Medicare benefits, coverage options, and preventive services. This service is available to current Medicare beneficiaries, their representatives, and individuals nearing Medicare eligibility.
